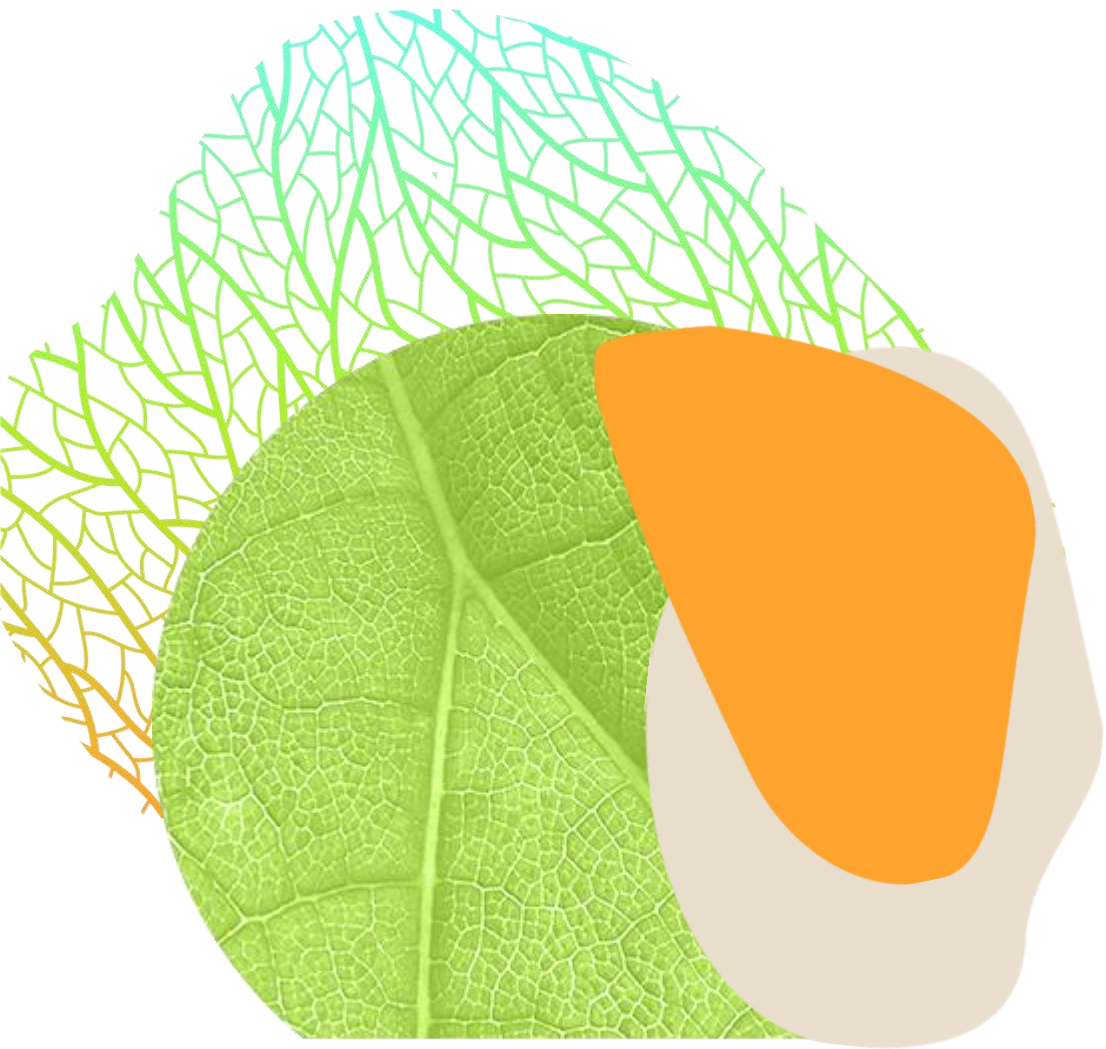




EUROPEAN GREEN DEAL

European Green Deal means we are committed to:

- Reduce emissions **by at least 55% in 2030** (compared to 1990)
- **Be net climate neutral in 2050**
- Take actions to **walk the talk**

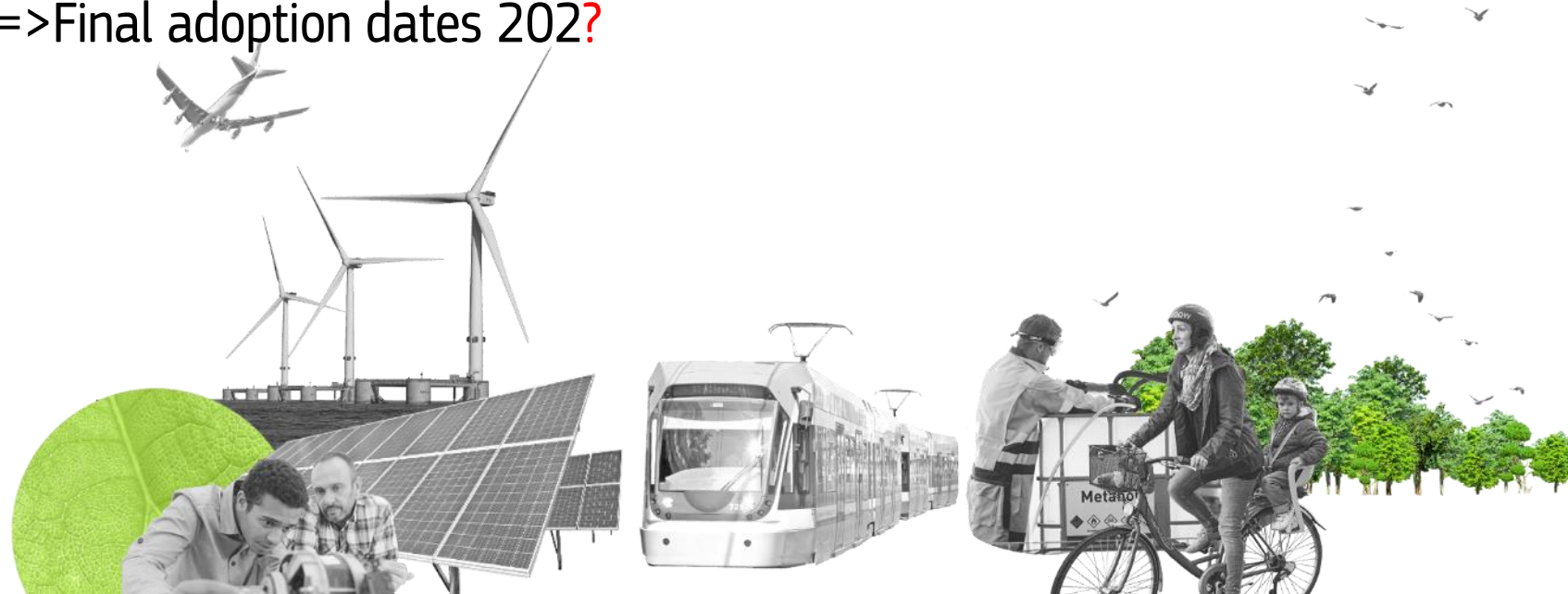
EU encourages other countries to step up their ambition and actions

Aligning EU rules to meet more ambitious climate target

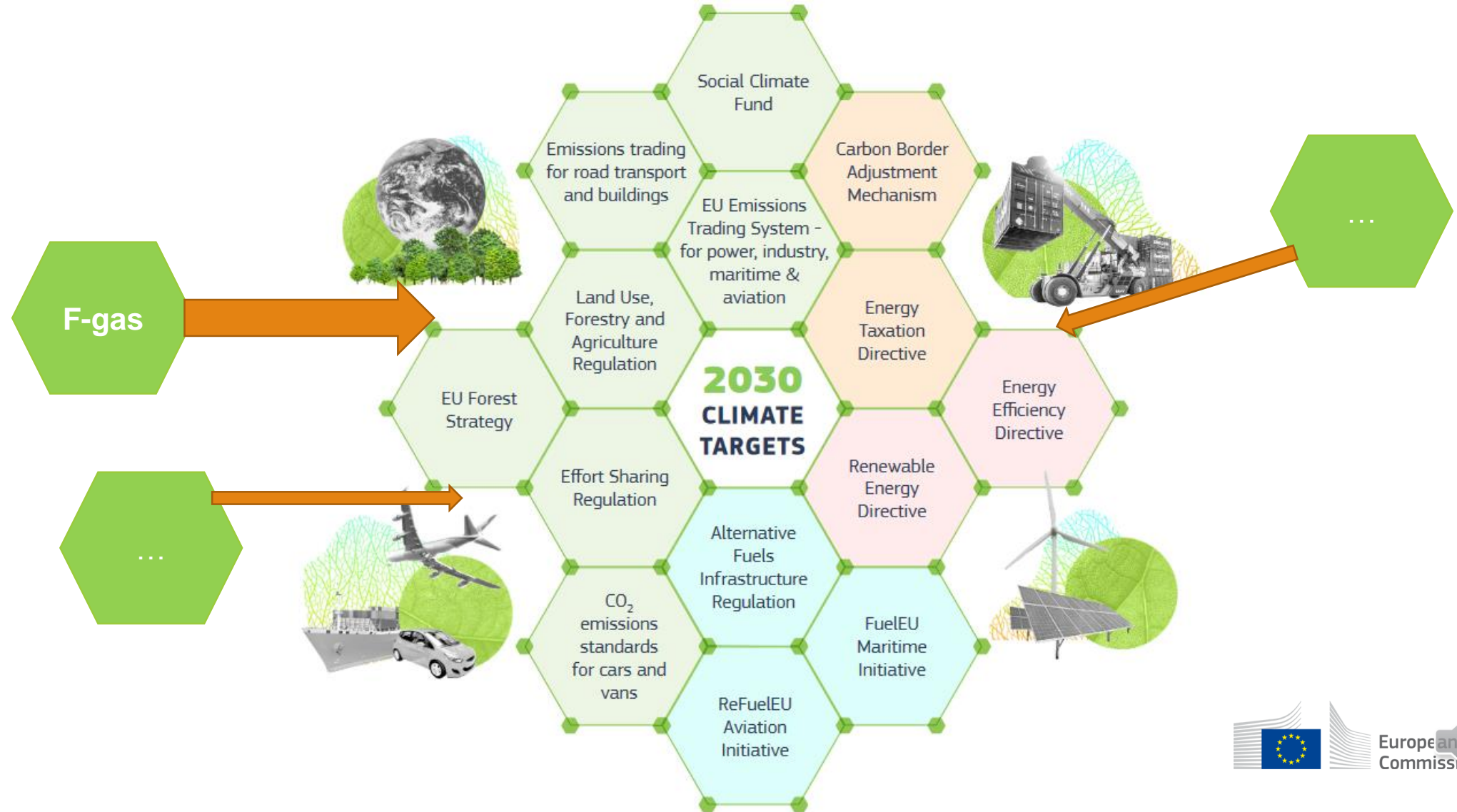
- July 2021 European Commission made **proposals** to make some of the EU's climate and energy policies **fit for reducing net greenhouse gas emissions by at least 55% by 2030**, compared to 1990 levels.

... to be **negotiated and adopted** by the **Council** (Ministers from 27 Member States) and the **European Parliament** (705 MEPs directly elected in Member States)

=>Final adoption dates 202?

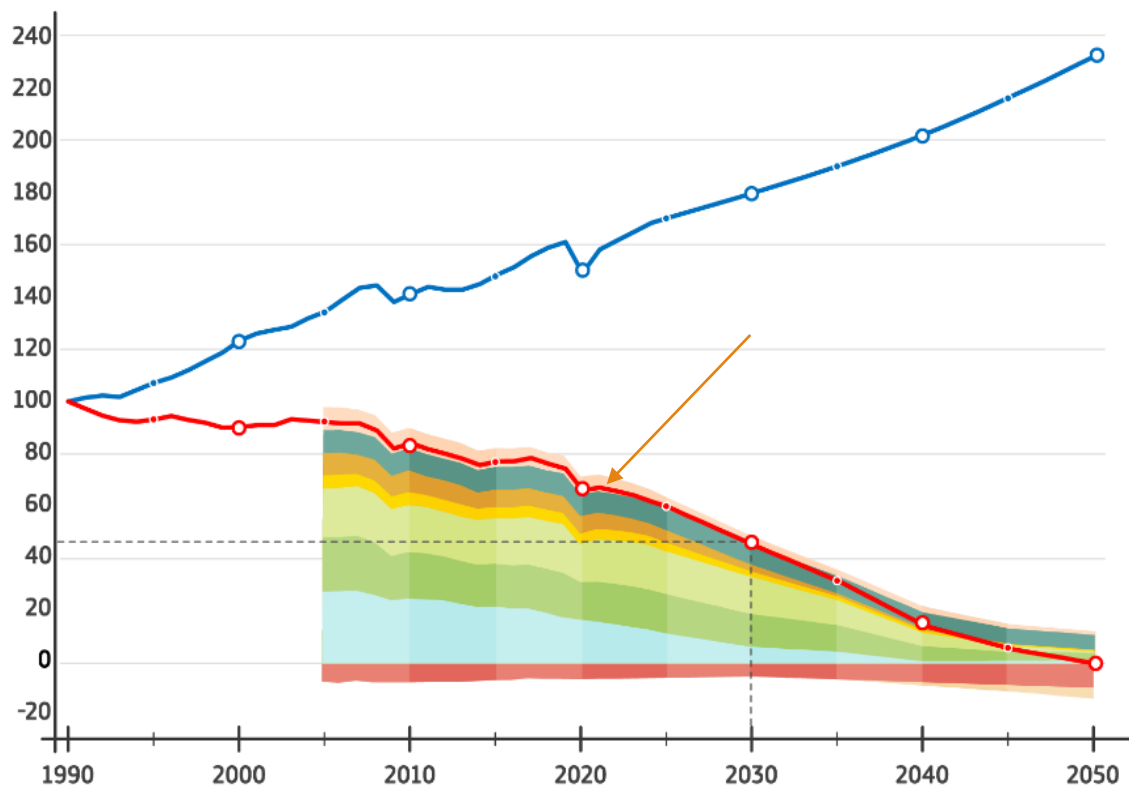


All relevant sectors must contribute higher climate ambition



Achieving EU's climate objectives

-55% in 2030 and climate neutrality in 2050



F-gas ->



New 2030 renewable and efficiency targets



Was
32%

Set a new EU-level target of **40%** renewables in the energy mix



Set a benchmark of **49%** of renewables in buildings



Increase the use of renewable energy in heating and cooling by **1.1 percentage point** every year



Raise the use of renewable energy in district heating and cooling by **2.1 percentage points** every year

Energy efficiency targets of minus 36-39% in 2030 (was 32.5%)

Tuning the future F-gas Regulation

Stakeholder
consultation

- ↓ Evaluation of current Regulation -> Overall approach is OK but we need to tune the measures (review objectives)
- ↓ Identifying potential measures that can address the issues identified in the evaluation
- ↓ Assessing climate, economic and social impacts of potential measures



We are here

Review objectives and potential measures

A. Align to the Green Deal climate ambition

- Steeper phase down & new F-gas prohibitions based on cost levels / technical feasibility (incl. safety and 'energy efficiency first')

B. Streamline with Montreal Protocol

- Phase down after 2030 & no minimum thresholds

C. Better implementation and enforcement

- Specific customs related rules & include low-GWP alternatives in certification of technicians

D. Improve monitoring and reporting.

E. Coherence and clarifications
